**MINUTES OF THE PAVILION/ SPORT FIELD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON
28 FEBRUARY 2024

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Committee noted their acceptance of the Minutes of Pavilion/ Sport Field meeting held on 22 November 2023, and the Committee **Resolved**, unanimously, that they were a true record.

3. RECEIVE AN UPDATE ON PAVILION DESIGN AND COST

A committee member advised that they had costed up two pavilions, that were fully insulated and fitted.

Wooden Pavilion:	£215,000
Brick:	£290,000

The committee asked the Clerk to ask the Parish Council which design they would prefer.

It was noted that the brick building would still look like a wooden pavilion but would be a much more substantial building which could be used throughout the year.

4. RECEIVE AN UPDATE ON PLANNING PERMISSION AND NEXT STEPS

Once the Parish Council have decided on the type of Pavilion they would like built, the next steps are to get a design drawn up. It will cost around £5,000.00 for the initial design drawings, building regs and planning permission.

5. RECEIVE AN UPDATE ON GRANTS AND FUNDRAISING

A member of the committee advised they will be applying for the South Downs Nation Park CIL funding for the pavilion. The amount they ask for will be determined on which pavilion the Parish Council decide one. The grant closes on 7th April.

Once the committee know which design is preferred, they can start to fundraise. They expect to have to fundraise for half the amount.

6. AGREEMENT ON THE NEXT VILLAGE SPORTS DAY

The committee agreed to hold the next Owslebury Sports day on Saturday 13th July 2024. The committee also hope to organise some social cricket games during the summer.
