Describe Owslebury in 3 words





What is the main benefit of living in Owslebury and Morestead?

19% of people said that the community was one of the main benefits of living in the village.

14% of the people said that living close to the city is one of the main benefits of living in the village.

11% of the people said that living in a rural community was one of the main benefits of living in the village.

10% of the people said that living in the Countryside was one of the main benefits of living in the village.



What do you see as the main drawbacks of living in Owslebury and Morestead?

34% of People felt the lack of public transports was a drawback of living in the village

22% of People felt that having no shop was a drawback of living in the village

18% of People felt that the village was being used as a rat run in the rush hours

5% of People felt that speeding traffic was a drawback of living in the village

3% of People felt that the narrow roads were a drawback of living in the village

17% People would like to see traffic calming measures

PARISH REPORT 2023/24



Planning



- > Planning process in WCC/SNDP is still incredibly slow
- ➤ 21 planning applications processed in 2023/24, 12 without comment, 4 objections and 5 the Parish Council asked for conditions to be placed on the application.
- WCC/SDNP have approved 11 of the applications and 10 applications have yet to be decided.



Grants



The Parish Council have £2,000 this year to give to local groups

The Parish Council paid out £1,732.00 in Grants over the year to:

- ➤ Citizen Advice £250 To help local people
- > St Andrews Church £1,000.00 For grass cutting and tree works
- ➤ Morestead Church £200 For grass cutting
- Owslebury Newsletter £150.00 To help towards printing costs
- ➤ Winchester Village Trust £32.00 To help towards their Insurance
- ➤ Life Education Wessex £100.00 To help towards the primary school health education day

The Parish Council have money every year for local groups We want to give out more money





Sports Field



- > The Parish Council have agreed for a modular brick pavilion to be built
- The next stage is to get the design drawn up and to apply for planning permission
- > The Committee are hoping for the pavilion to be built in 2025
- The Committee have set up cricket sessions which started in April for primary aged children
- Due to the success of the sports afternoon in 2023 the Committee will be hosting another sports afternoon on Saturday 13th July
- > The jubilee trees have been planted in the field
